# Walking Tour

## Distance: 1.1 Miles

### **The Greater Dade City Chamber of Commerce - 1**

Begin tour by walking East on Church Avenue to 7th Street and turn to walk North.

### **Telephone Building - 2**

Constructed in 1924, in Mediterranean revival style, by the Florida Telephone Company. For many years it housed switchboards and offices.

### **Williams Building - 3**

Built in 1926 as a clothing store and continues to this day as a clothing store and restaurant helmed by a descendant of O.N. Williams.

### **Historic Pasco County Courthouse - 4**

Constructed in 1909, it was the county seat of government for Pasco County for more than 50 years and was originally built at the cost of \$35,860.

### **Wells Fargo Bank - 5**

One of the cornerstones of the revitalization of downtown Dade City, it is a faithful recreation of the original Bank of Pasco County. When the crash of 1929 arrived, every bank in the county was forced to close except the Bank of Pasco County.

### **Quilts on Plum Lane - 6**

This building was constructed of brick in 1919 and originally called the Bank of Dade City, which closed with the collapse of the Florida Boom in 1926.

### **Centennial Building - 7**

Formerly the old Coleman & Ferguson Building in 1923 and remodeled in 1987. It housed one of the city's leading general stores.

### **Griffin Block Building - 8**

constructed in 1905, it was originally the Griffin Drug Store.

### **Treiber Building - 9**

Constructed about 1900 as a hardware store and offices, it is the oldest commercial building in Pasco County.

### **Touchton Building - 10**

On the SW corner of 7th Street and Meridian Avenue, it was constructed in 1908, originally as a drug store and office. It houses Kiefer Village Jewels now.

### **Edwinola - 11**

As you walk past Agnes Lamb Park, the original front part of the Edwinola hotel was constructed in 1912 as a fashionable hotel.

### **Lock Home - 12**

At the top of the hill, this home was formerly the Azalea House Bed & Breakfast and originally constructed in 1906 as the home of Christopher and Lucy Lock, prominent residents of that period. This home incorporates an earlier 1890s building which was transported from Lake Pasadena by mules.

### **Hattie Spencer Home - 13**

Hattie Spencer was the Dade City Post Mistress from 1897-1936.

### **Pinholster Home - 14**

As you continue walking past the lovely Price Park on your right, stop and enjoy two homes on the other side of Meridian Avenue. On the left, the Pinholster Home was originally constructed in 1898, with a lovely gingerbread porch.

### **Daiger-Jackson - 15**

The lovely Doric columns on the right were constructed in 1910, once the home of Dade City Surgeon, Dr. Thomas Jackson.

### **Meridian Apartments - 16**

On the corner of 12th Street and Meridian Avenue is the Meridian Apartments. Built in the 1920's, this is an example of Florida Boom Architecture.

### **Boon-Seay Home - 17**

Built in 1900, it was the long-time residence of J. Emmitt Evans, famous Dade City citrus grower.

### **Sistrunk Home - 18**

Built in the 1890s in plantation style. Dr. Sistrunk was one of Dade City's pioneer doctors.

### **First Presbyterian Church - 19**

Built in the early 1890s, it is the oldest intact church building in Dade City.

### **Dr. Jackson Clinic - 20**

Built in 1922-23, it was a 2-room hospital until 1935. Now turn around and backtrack to Church Avenue and 15th Street.

### **Raymond Brown Home - 21**

Built in 1887, it features Victorian gingerbread trim and a wrap-around porch.

### **First Baptist Church - 22**

Formerly College Street Baptist Church, congregation organized in 1891, the church was built here in 1892. The first structure burned down in 1899.

### **Knight Home - 23**

This is a Dutch Colonial style home with a gambrel roof built in 1901.

### **Tipton Home - 24** constructed in 1918.

### **The Ward-Johnson Home - 25**

Built by noted local contractor Jones Ward in 1925-26.

### **Home Built In 1940s - 26**

Neighboring to the left of the Ward-Johnson home.

### **The next home - 27** was built in 1901.

### **The Ross Larkin Home - 28**

Built in 1881, was originally a typical Florida structure of three rooms, with a hall in the middle and a side porch.

### **First United Methodist Church - 29**

Parts of this building are believed to date from 1889, when a church was erected by James E. Lee, a pioneer from Dawson, GA, who came with his family by covered wagon in 1881.

### **Gray Moss Inn - 30**

Built in about 1910, in the Mediterranean Revival style. Its claim to fame is having hosted Calvin Coolidge for lunch, the only U.S. president to visit Pasco County.

### **The McIntosh Home - 31**

Built in 1898, was the residence of Catherine McIntosh, the society editor of the Dade City Banner.

### **The McCutchen Home - 32** was built in 1910.

### **Dade City Waterworks - 33**

Built by the city in 1924, it was the first public water system in Pasco County.

### **American Legion Hall - 34**

Built in 1919, it has always been a meeting hall.

### **Ward Home - 35**

Built in 1898 and was recently renovated.
